Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

The readings today remind us that poetic imagery is an apt way of describing the mysterious presence of God in our midst. The cedar began as a seedling that takes years to grow into a magnificent tree.



The same is true of the mustard tree. It too requires time to develop its trunk and branches. The development of moral integrity in a human being is just as gradual. Rooted in God, it flourishes in God's presence and it produces fruit even into old age. Although God is present in all things, sustaining them and allowing them to follow their natural courses, God really transcends all things. Metaphorical language may be the best means for speaking about God and the things of God. It enables us to live in the tension that both reveals something about God and conceals God's real nature.

The reign of God also begins in very ordinary circumstances, and it matures gradually until it has spread itself far and wide. Although the mystery of the reign of God unfolds within human history, we need eyes of faith to recognise it. Like the cedar and the mustard seed, it grows within the concreteness of human experience. Just as the life force that thrusts the branches of the trees further and further out cannot itself be seen, so the reign of God is mysterious, even incomprehensible. Still, it is there, inviting us, urging us to move forward, transforming our world.

COVID SAFETY REMINDERS AND HOUSEKEEPING PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU READ

- Please maintain social distancing at all times in and around the Church.
- You can now register your attendance at Mass <u>either</u> via the paper form or via the QR code. Both are available at the back of the Church. If you are registering on paper, <u>please record one</u> <u>person per line.</u> That way it is easier to ensure numbers allowed are not exceeded.



- While sitting in the pews, please ensure you are 1.5 metres from the person in front, behind and next to you. (You are only exempt if you are from the same household)
- Face masks are no longer mandatory but they are still recommended.
- Congregational singing is now permitted under the 2 square metre rule.
- Please form <u>one line</u> when receiving Holy Communion and keep 1.5 metres from the person in front and behind you.
- Parishioners sitting at the right of the Church are to receive communion on the right and those sitting on the left are to receive on the left. That way social distancing is easier to maintain.
- Please take your bulletin with you and dispose of the seat wipes in the bin available at the back of the Church. If you don't do this then someone else has to clean up after you.
- Please leave the Church immediately after Mass and do not congregate inside or outside the doors of the Church. If you wish to chat, please move to the driveway or street but please still maintain social distancing.
- If we are inspected and found not to be complying with regulations for Places of Worship, the Parish, as well as any individual found not to be complying, can be issued an on the spot fine of \$1,000– and the Parish will also be fined \$55,000-.
- We would like to thank everyone for their patience and help in trying to keep our Parish and community safe.
