

*Father's Day* 5th September, 2021

Such courtesy and sensitivity! The deaf man when brought to Jesus by his friends probably didn't know what was going on. Being the centre of attention in the midst of a group of strangers would have only added to his confusion and embarrass-



ment. So Jesus takes him aside and there, one on one, mimics what he intends to do – unstop his ears, heal his tongue. Jesus doesn't just foist healing upon the man. Touching a person's ears, anointing the tongue are acts of familiarity and one can imagine the tenderness with which Jesus would have done them. No wonder he groaned. He probably saw in the man's face the depths of loneliness he had suffered. Those watching at a distance may have misinterpreted his actions as magic but Jesus' look to heaven showed the true source of his power. All it took was a single word of command to overturn the years of loneliness and isolation.

Scriptural commentators interpret the initial verses of this reading to mean that Jesus spent some time in Gentile territory and that this miracle was typical of the healings that Jesus did during his wanderings over the Decapolis region. Though he performed many miracles, each was a unique encounter for the individual. One on one, heart reached out to heart. This gives us the courage to ponder: 'If Jesus came to me, how would he take me aside and what would he heal?'

## REST IN THE LOVE OF YOUR GOD.

Ask Jesus to come close to you and show you where you are deaf in your life. Imagine him touching your ears, anointing your tongue. Ask him what he wants you to understand. Ponder what he reveals for some time.

When you have received this teaching and healing, ask him how you are to proclaim it in your life.
