Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

24th October, 2021

My father has his first, and only, heart attack in St Vincent's Hospital as he was waiting for heart surgery. The doctors decided not to bring forward his quadruple by-pass surgery but leave it at the scheduled time. Dad



said he spent the next 36 hours in intensive care, repeating a cry very like Bartimaeus', 'Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me, a sinner'. Like Bartimaeus, he prayed from the depths of his need.

Desperation can be a great gift. It focuses us on reality as it truly is. In his need, Bartimaeus did not care what the crowd thought, whether they were telling him to be quiet or how to relate to Jesus. In his need, he knew who Jesus was at a level deeper than this crowd knew. In his need, he was able to state simply and starkly what he wanted from Jesus. In his need, he realised what truly mattered. Unlike James and John, in last week's Gospel, who, when asked by Jesus what they wanted, had sought power and prestige, this man's need was simple and basic. And when Jesus fulfilled his need, he responded in the true manner of a disciple, following Jesus along the way the way leading to Jerusalem, to suffering, death and through to Resurrection.

Our desperate needs are to be treasured. When their time has passed and our lives have returned to what passes for normalcy, for equilibrium, we should often revisit them to recollect the wisdom they have to offer us: the clarity regarding what is truly important in life, the knowledge that we can truly open ourselves to God, the experience that God can be truly merciful and tender in our lives.

#### REST IN THE LOVE OF YOUR GOD.

Recall the situations where you have been truly desperate and have called out to God for help. Take one of those situations and slowly remember what lead to it, how you felt, what it was that made it so difficult for you. Then recall slowly how God lead you, what type of comfort and support you were given, if you felt God wasn't moving quickly enough or doing the 'right' thing. Remember how the situation finally evolved and hopefully, resolved.

Looking back on that situation, what have you learnt from it. Express that to God in gratitude.

## CATHOLIC SPECIAL RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (SRE)/SCRIPTURE IN LOCAL PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOLS

Did you know that Catholic Scripture is offered as part of the regular school timetable in the public schools of our parish? Catholic SRE/Scripture supports the family by providing lessons where students can comfortably ask questions and discover the relevance of their faith in today's society. The number of stu-



dents attending Catholic Scripture in the state's high schools have declined greatly in the past 2 years and these faith lessons are in danger of being discontinued. (Even when parents enrol their children in scripture classes, schools do not always ensure that students attend the correct SRE classes or any at all). We are appealing to you the parents. Have a conversation with your children about which scripture class they attend, or perhaps take the step to enrol them into Catholic Scripture. Look through the SRE Flyer at the back of the Church to better understand the situation and contact details regarding SRE lessons in public schools.

#### SYNOD 2021-2023

On Oct. 10, 2021, Pope Francis formally opened a two-year process called "a synod on synodality," officially known as "Synod 2021-2023: For a Synodal Church." In brief, the process involves an expansion of an established institution, called the "Synod of Bishops." This means that bishops around the world will consult with everyone from parishioners to monks, nuns and Catholic universities before coming together for a discussion in 2023. The topic? How the church can learn to rely more fully on this kind of consultation-and-discussion process – how it can become more "synodal" in its governance. Throughout the centuries, the Roman Catholic Church has held many gatherings called "synods" – but seldom one this sweeping in its potential consequences. In part, it is designed to make church governance more open and inclusive of all its members.

# COVID SAFETY REMINDERS AND HOUSEKEEPING PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU READ

- Please maintain social distancing at all times in and around the Church.
- As restrictions are one person per 4 square metres, we are only allowed **65 people** in the Church at one time.
- Bookings are therefore required for weekend Masses, and you
   are requested to check in with the QR code for all Masses. If that
   is not possible, there is a sign in sheet available at the back of the Church.



- While sitting in the pews, please ensure you are 1.5 metres from the person in front, behind and next to you. (You are only exempt if you are from the same household)
- FACE MASKS ARE AGAIN MANDATORY.
- CONGREGATIONAL SINGING IS NOT PERMITTED.
- Please form <u>one line</u> when receiving Holy Communion and keep 1.5 metres from the person in front and behind you.
- Parishioners sitting at the right of the Church are to receive communion on the right and those sitting on the left are to receive on the left. That way social distancing is easier to maintain.
- Please take your bulletin with you and dispose of the seat wipes in the bin available at the back of the Church.
- Please leave the Church immediately after Mass. You are welcome to chat outside the Church on the driveway or street but please still maintain social distancing.
- Live streaming of the 9am Mass will continue for parishioners who are especially vulnerable or who would still prefer to attend Mass online.
- Please note: the priests and staff of St Matthew's are fully vaccinated however, places of worship
  are not required to check peoples vaccination status so we do not guarantee that all those attending Masses are fully vaccinated.
- We would like to thank everyone for their patience and help in trying to keep our Parish and community safe.
