Third Sunday of Advent Year C 12th December, 2021

'And just what were you expecting?' Expectations play a significant role in the emotional landscape of our lives. They can be a force in determining what we do. And delight or disappointment can follow from whether they are fulfilled or not.



Central to John the Baptist's call to repentance is a re-calibration of the people's expectation regarding salvation. In the text immediately preceding this Sunday's Gospel he has been aggressively attacking the presumptuous expectation of the people that their descent from Abraham would be the source of salvation for those who could claim such. Shock and disappointment must have reverberated through his hearers and we hear their response three times in this Sunday's Gospel -"What must we do?"

His responses would have challenged them yet again. Having come out into the wilderness to hear this firebrand preacher they must have expected a vigorous program of ascetic endeavour and prayer. They probably shook their heads and wondered if they had heard him right when he told them, essentially, to be generous and just in the ordinary course of their lives. No fasting, no praying and what, no deprivation! 'Give from your excess when there is a person in need.' 'Even if your job is a despised one like tax-collecting or soldiering for the occupying force, do it justly and be content with the right income.' No wonder the people thought John might be the Christ – these views were so radical.

Having heard John's challenges to the people, it is a good idea this Advent to hear and apply them to ourselves. We need to ask some serious questions: just what do we expect from our faith and what do we think we have to do to live out our faith? Applying John's criteria to our lives might not be what we expected but fulfilling them may well challenge us more that we could know.

REST IN THE LOVE OF YOUR GOD.

The people coming to John had a feeling of expectancy and John by his preaching, challenges them to align their expectation with God's desire for them.

As you rest in God's love, ask yourself what are the expectations you place on yourself? In relation to God? In relation to your family and friends.

Then ask yourself what expectations you believe God has on you? On your relationships with family and friends? With regards to your work? Is there a discrepancy between your expectations and God's?

RE: COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS) UPDATE FROM THE DIOCESE 8/12/21

The NSW Government has announced some changes to the reopening roadmap for the COVID-19 restrictions. Based on the announcement, the restrictions will ease further when <u>NSW reaches 95% double vaccination or on 15 December 2021</u>, whichever comes first. For places of worship the following will apply from when the state hits the milestone:

Density Limits

There will no longer be any square meter rules applicable for Parishes. This includes the Church and other buildings within the Parish.

Weddings and Funerals

Proof of vaccination will no longer be mandatory. All will be able to attend regardless of vaccination status.

Choir and Singing

Singing will be permitted for everyone in attendance.

Social Events

Parish social events can resume with no person limit.

Masks

Masks will no longer be mandatory at places of worship. However, this is still strongly encouraged in venues where social distancing is not possible.

COVID-19 Safe Check-in and Record Keeping

Check in using the NSW QR Code and record keeping of all attendees are still required for places of worship.

COVID-19 Safety Plans

COVID-19 Safety Plans will no longer be mandatory.
