Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C 17th July, 2022 Most of us at some point have experienced the fret and fuss of a Martha and Mary clash of tempera-

ment in the home. The hardworking Martha is not happy with the idling Mary and expresses it to Jesus that her sister should be engaged in something more important than listening to him. But Jesus commended Mary for choosing the better part. St. Theresa said that if Martha had imitated Mary, Jesus would have gone without dinner. We are wondering just how does this story fits into our lives and what exactly is the Lord saying to us through it?

We take home the message that no matter how busy we are, we should take time to sit quietly and find the Lord in our world of work and be guided by him. It is easy to get our priorities all mixed up and finding little or no time to listen to the Word of God and to pray. The danger is that if we do not find time to listen and pray, we become slaves of our duties. We rush about and yet the important things can remain undone.
