INVITE JESUS TO HEAL US

Only a very stony-hearted person would remain unmoved at the sight of a blind man, cane in hand and tapping his way across a busy street. Blindness is one of life's biggest burdens. Life for



a blind person is an endless dark night in solitary confinement. Having stated clearly in John 9:1-41 that the man's disability has nothing to do with sin, Jesus restores his sight. His healing is instantaneous, and the man experiences the world in a new way, seeing what human faces and hands look like for the first time. Some of his neighbours and the Pharisees did not wish him well of his cure and tried to force him into denial that his sight had been restored. He quickly learns that there is more to sight than seeing the light of day. There is a deeper spiritual blindness which comes from closing the windows of our soul and pulling down the shutters in order to keep out Jesus who is the light of the world.

At a deeper level, the gospel story reminds us that we are all born blind and groping in spiritual darkness and at baptism we begin our journey of faith in the likeness of Christ. The life we receive at baptism gives us the power to bring Christ to everything we do and to every person we meet. We are meant to be a beacon of light for others by our good example. Lent is an opportune time to reflect on how we are living out our baptismal commitment and to see how Christ influences our behaviour.

We are invited to be courteous and friendly in our dealings with one another. Families who are not on speaking terms because of past differences should remind themselves that they have shut the light of God's love from one another and have substituted the darkness of hatred and the blindness of jealousy thus are unable to see anything good in the other.

Christ is asking us to look at our blind spots because coming from darkness into light is not an easy journey. It takes time and requires patience because of the many pitfalls on the road. In spite of our best resolutions the light of Christ is inclined to grow dim within us. Jesus knows our weaknesses and is willing to help us provided we come to him for healing. Having been called to walk as the children of the light we must keep praying: 'Lord, that I may see'.
