What's your demon?

My father was a gambler – or so I have been told. Mum used to say, 'Your father's a gambler, that's why he took up



mushroom farming.' It was only after he died that I learnt the story. He came from a poor family and having gotten a scholarship to university, he lost a lot of that money on the horses. Well, through sheer hard work he was able to stay at Uni but he never bet on the horses again. Early in life, he faced a demon squarely and judged how weak he was. And he was the better man for it.

We each and all have demons. Part of the genius of the 12 step programs is to get people to face them squarely. Our demons don't have to be as obvious as addiction to alcohol, gambling or drugs. Anything that undermines the growth of life and love within us is a 'demon'. The man Jesus cured in this Gospel was not a vicious low life. This was a respectable man who attended synagogue! So what was his demon – resentment, concern for respectability, fear of what others think? We need to face our demons because it is then that we will be open to the salvation that Jesus offers: life to the full. If our lives seem less than full, we need to come before Jesus and ask for the healing that he so wants to give us.

REST IN THE LOVE OF GOD

Jesus showed his authority by confronting the evil in peoples' lives and bringing them healing. When you are at rest in God's love, consider the places in your heart that seem to be enmeshed in darkness, the attitudes and actions about which you are ashamed. Bring them before Jesus and ask for his love to touch that area of your life. Ask him what form he would like your healing to take. Under the guidance of the Spirit ask how he would like you to be free. Open your heart, your mind and your life to his healing.

let me never be put to shame, for I call on you.




