'How will it end?' is a question implicit in the beginning of every story and one that sustains the interest through to the end. In a good story, be it film, book or even a yarn, we



expect a certain continuity between the elements of the story and the ending and yet feel cheated if the ending is too pat or, alternatively, if the resolution is imported at the end. Similarly in the best humour, the joke comes from an unusual interaction between the elements that we have failed to see as the joke progressed but which hits us in the punch line.

As the ending of his own personal story in this world is about to take place, Jesus places his own particular drama within the drama of world history and, at the same time, enfolds each one of his individual followers within that story. To the disciples, to the early Church, Jesus' going looked like a disaster. But before he went to his ignominious death Jesus proclaimed that disaster is not the end of the story. The disciples caught glimpses of his Resurrection but, in Mark's Gospel, it is no more than that – glimpses. They were given assurances that his Death has turned to triumph. They had heard the teaching that he will return as the triumphant Son of Man gathering his chosen from the ends of the earth. But in the reality of their lives, they lived in the tension of this mysterious story of the presence of God in our world – radiant but not yet fully visible. In a very real sense, they had each to make the story of Jesus' journey through sin and suffering to resurrection their own.

As we do. Each of us has enough struggles and temptations to realise that disaster can easily overtake our lives...and at certain times it does. Why this happens to us, we do not know. But what we do know is that if we cleave to the words of Jesus, live his life, even die his death, our story will end with all resolved in the glorious love of God.

REST IN THE LOVE OF YOUR GOD.

Reflect on the trials and sufferings that you have experienced in your life. When you were in difficulty did you realise that God was close to you, ready to uphold you in your darkness and pain? Though you may not have felt it at the time, can you discern how the Spirit led you?

Drawing on what you learnt then, how can this knowledge give you light and guidance in the challenges you face now?
