

Exultation of the Cross Year C 14th September, 2025





have you abandoned me.' We tend to forget for, more often than not, we are running as fast as we can away from the difficult and complex situations of life. And not just each of us personally – we also do it on the community level. Think Asylum Seekers. Think the institutional response to Sexual Abuse. Think the current situation in Ukraine or the Middle East.

One way we avoid the pain is by applying blame, often too readily and too quickly. But before we start applying blame, either to ourselves or others, we may need to 'abide' in the mess, muddle and pain, not only to see what the real issues are but also to give God a chance to reveal what his transformative grace might do in that dreadful situation. Jesus stayed on the cross for three hours, in the tomb for three days. The lessons of our pain need time to sink in. Only then can we truly enter into the experience of Exaltation of our cross that he offers.

Often the Gospel stress how 'resolutely' Jesus went to Jerusalem, knowing that he was facing suffering and death. We too must resolutely enter into our pain so that it may crack open the shell of our indifference and complacency and allow the new life of grace to rise.

REST IN THE LOVE OF YOUR GOD.

Consider one difficult or painful situation that you have to face at this point in time. As you ponder on it, note the various ways in which it causes you distress. In the presence of Jesus sit with this for some time.

Ask Jesus to enlighten you as to how this situation could be a cause of growth for you or for those you love. Consider the different aspects of the situation. Ask Jesus to show you what you could do to bring about some transformation that would bring life.
