Twenty Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C 5th October, 2025

This parable extols a value that is largely undervalued in our present society: duty. Like Cinderella, working, dirty and ignored in the kitchen, it is passed over by many for more attractive values, like courage, leadership, crea-



tivity. Yet however much most of us would like to exercise those values, it is so often duty to mundane tasks that forms our ordinary lives. We 'tend the fields and cattle, cook and serve the meal' and, at the end of it all, have done no more than our duty. But is that all there is to these words of Jesus? We are followers of the one who emptied himself to become a slave, a servant. One, who for thirty years did his duty as an obedient son in a humble household in the backblocks of Galilee. One, who even in his public ministry, did it in such a way as to draw glory to God, not to himself. In his Agony in the Garden, we see the cost that duty was to him. In his death, we see the pain it entailed. But in his Resurrection, we see that this Cinderella of virtues finally comes, not to the ball, but into the fullness of the Kingdom of God.

So what does that mean for us, with the mundane duties to be done this day, this week? The heart of the matter lies in how we choose to fulfil our duties. We can choose to do them grudgingly, even complainingly. Or we can choose to do them, with him who chose to do his duty with us. We can choose to do them peaceably and with love, leaving their fulfilment in the Kingdom to the Father who cares over all. We may not get to choose what we have to do but we get to choose the love with which we do it.

## **REST IN THE LOVE OF YOUR GOD.**

Consider your place in your world. How important do you feel yourself to be? Is being important, important to you?

Imagine yourself as a servant, only doing one's duty. What does that do to your sense of importance? Does it undermine it, or release you into the freedom of knowing that God is working powerfully in your life, working all things for good.
