Twenty Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

In telling this parable, Jesus describes an adult in about the weakest position in his society. This widow had no voice, no public persona, no forum in which she could present her case. The judge is described as unscrupulous and resistant to influence from God or men. In other words, the wid-



ow's situation could not have been more desperate. Her need drove her to levels of behaviour that were probably unthinkable in ordinary times. Indeed, Jesus has her threatening violence! Obviously, in offering her as a model for prayer, Jesus is not recommending violence, nor is he offering the unjust judge as a model of God's behaviour. So just what is he teaching us in this curious parable?

The key is given in the words with which Jesus introduces it. Jesus speaks of the need to pray continually and never give up. We often struggle with prayer...we get bored, we lose attention, we want to be elsewhere...and with those experiences the whole idea of praying continually seems an impossibility. But maybe the problem lies it what we envisage prayer to be. We know it is an engagement of our hearts and our beings with God. We imagine it as time resting with God, sharing our hearts and hearing what God has to say to us...and sometimes this is what happens...but also sometimes, and if we are honest even oftentimes, it doesn't. And we think we have failed or that God has failed us. Perhaps the problem is that in the times we are 'bored' we are bringing the wrong part of ourselves to God. The widow cried out from her deep-seated need...and we all have that. Deep down, we know that our hearts are cracked and broken, we know we are fragile. If we can trust enough to encounter God from that need, we will pray constantly. When our need meets God's grace, we will crave prayer. It will not be a work we have to do, but a fountain of life welling up within us. At the conclusion of this Gospel, Jesus asks if the Son of Man will find faith when he comes. The faith he wants is us bringing our broken sinfulness to his deep mercy. All we have to do is hold out our weak hands and suffering hearts.

merciful love, to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine.


